The following topics were discussed:

Nikki Koenig Nielson, Director of Operations from Shingebiss Associates – company has recently had a management turn-around, but Glen Gidaly is still owner of company. Several funding grants coming up with transportation. One grant has a deadline of June 30<sup>th</sup>, namely Safetealu. Any time you partner with your village it makes grant applications much more attractive. Money wouldn't be available until 2007/08. May need 20% match from town; 3<sup>rd</sup> party cost estimate of opinion of probable cost. Upper River Alliance grant is due May 26<sup>th</sup> \$75,000.00 with Village of Saugerties, Tivoli, Athens and Hudson.

**Michael Moriello, Esq. for Glasco Ponds** – we will need to hold Public Hearings; stormwater district and charges will be on tax bill. Eighteen acres of subdivision will become Town of Saugerties land, 47 acres to be developed (69 lots). Each 5 year interval will need to clean out bottom of sediment ponds; will not be at hazardous waste level. Ponds must be minimum of 6' deep. Will schedule Public Hearing for 5:30 p.m. June 21, 2006.

CAC/CPC received copies of the report from Dennis Doyle regarding Sensitive Overlay; some members walked the quarry at Solite to get idea about mining. Public Access 23 interviewed candidates and will meet next Thursday and will also host 24 hours of local broadcasting. Thanked Michael Zinkow for great effort with website.

**Councilman Costello** – very busy with Buildings and Grounds, thanked Joe Goldpaugh for terrific paving job. Thank you also to Bob Ciarlante, Ray Mayone and Town Highway Department. Thanked the Squire Family for their involvement in the Jaycee Field, it's nice to see activity once again for the youth in that area. Pleased to report that we have reached an agreement with the PBA and will approve the Contract.

**Councilwoman Campbell** – Economic Development Patterns for Progress, will be attended by Councilwoman Campbell along with Beth Murphy and Barbara Budik on May 17, 2006. Artists are enthusiastic about mural; Greg's staff has been very helpful. We are working on getting preliminary tax rolls on website, should be up and running in a few weeks.

Let it be resolved that Gregory L. Helsmoortel, Supervisor of the Town of Saugerties is hereby authorized to file an application for funds for <u>The Regional Habitat Research</u> <u>Network</u> from the NYS DEC 2006 Hudson River Estuary Action Agenda Grants

Program for Community Interpretive and Education Projects in accordance with Hudson River Estuary Management Act (ECL 11-0306) of NYS DEC in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 and upon approval of said request enter into and execute a project agreement with the Hudson River estuary program for such assistance to this, Town of Saugerties as lead applicant in partnership with the co-applicants and fellow members of the Upper Hudson River Alliance as part of the partnership of this project.

Discussion: Councilwoman Campbell added Saugerties is a member along with the Village, Tivoli, Athens and Hudson in a 25 mile stretch of river. This would be an internet based system and individuals would be able to record data.

Now Therefore, it is resolved, determined and ordered as follows: that a meeting and Public Hearing of the Town Board of the Town of Saugerties shall be held at the Frank D. Greco Senior Center located at Market Street in the Town of Saugerties, Ulster County, New York on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of June, 2006 at 5:30 p.m. of that day to consider the formation of the Glasco Ponds Stormwater Management District and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same and for such other action on the vote

of said Town Board with relation to said formation of the stormwater management district extension as may be required by law or proper in the premises; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Saugerties is hereby directed to publish this Resolution, Notice and Order in the official newspaper of the Town of Saugerties, at least once, with the first publication not less than ten (10) days nor more than twenty (20) days prior to the date of the aforesaid public hearing, and that said Town Clerk shall also cause a copy thereof to be posted on the Town's sign board, and shall preserve proof of such publication and posting.
