SUPERVISOR'S COMMENTS:

There will be a fundraiser held at Cantine this weekend for First Responders and Jack Rose Memorial. Cecelia Strong is fighting leukemia and a fundraiser is in the near future. Bob Siracusano had a band on First Friday at Main and Market Streets. Thank you to emergency

responders in the work they took on during the storm the other day. Also, the GOSER project has been approved.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Greg Chorvas – we will be able to open the new rear entrance, which is handicap accessible on Monday. During the storm Monday night, a tree came down and there was additional damage at Jaycee Field. The new Key FOB system will be installed this weekend. The original system is over 15 years old. Updates to Malden Park should be complete by Labor Day.

Claudia Andreassen – reopened court with limited size and safety measures in place.

BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Andreassen – HPC will meet next week; the Building Department has been busy. The Town of Rochester has a five year plan for capital improvements, which is a good idea. Spectrum has had several outages lately.

Councilwoman Thornton – Boys & Girls Club is holding a virtual auction on October 1-3. They are operational and they have a pre-k program. The Arts Commission will meet August 28 and the Artist Tour is on-line. STAC will meet at the senior center.

Councilman Ivino – Route 32 and NYS Thruway had encountered a few more accidents and the town board needs to push for a change. Police Commission will be picking people to serve in that capacity. Supervisor Costello added that the DOT has a draft of the study and will share with the town and county. Also, we are resending a request for Route 32 and Glasco Turnpike.

Councilman Schoonmaker – looking forward to starting the Police Commission. The Animal Shelter needs help with fundraising. Shout Out Saugerties held an event at the Village Beach and the next event will be on August 22, 2020.
