Creative Place/Map Making

Creative Placemaking is any artistic or creative effort to make a particular community stronger. Suzanne will make some inquiries to have a speaker come to one of the board meetings.

Phrase creative placemaking coined in 2010, embraced by the NEA, but the concept began much earlier.

Comes from the municipal art movement during the industrial revolution as an attempt to beautify towns and cities; and the Arts and Crafts movement since the late 1800's.

Building on what's there is the major premise. From the Esopus Creek development to understanding and mapping the present day creative action in Saugerties. Tenets of Creative Place:

- Quality of life Beauty
- Economic opportunity Aspiration
- Shared leadership and social critique
- Freedom and belonging bonding
- Asset-based orientation (building from what's there) Bridging between cultures

- Right to expressive life
- Place-based orientation (what makes one place different from another)
